

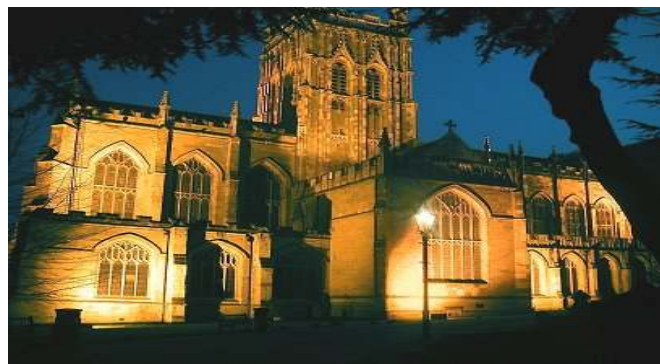
The Malvern Hills

Your first, far-off view of 'The Malverns' tells you that you are approaching an area with a difference; unusual and intriguing. They are the centre piece of a wonderful region stretching from lowland, riverside Upton upon Severn to Malvern itself, and up the River Teme's winding course through northwest Worcestershire's hills to the delightful Tenbury Wells. The breathtaking beauty of the windswept humps of the Malvern Hills has been the inspiration of many. Further west is the lovely Wye Valley, which widens as the river flows through Hereford and on to Ross-on-Wye. From here it is at its most beautiful as it passes through the horseshoe bend beneath the steep wooded slopes around Symonds Yat, and through the hills of the ancient Forest of Dean.



YOUR HOTEL



The Abbey Hotel in Great Malvern is in an idyllic setting adjoining a fine old Benedictine Priory, and its ivy clad exterior and old world charm conceal the facilities of this modern hotel. Each of its 108 bedrooms has private bathroom, colour TV, radio, telephone, and tea/coffee making facilities. A lift serves it's three floors. The hotel's comfortable restaurant, overlooking beautifully cultivated gardens, is renowned for the quality of its cuisine.

PROPOSED ITINERARY:

- Sunday:** We leave this morning and make our way to Malvern and the Abbey Hotel. With refreshment stops en route we expect to arrive at our hotel in plenty of time for our evening meal.
